# CRYSTAL CITY PROOF OF VACCINATION

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

With the Omicron variant taking off, The Mayor of the District of Columbia has released an order requiring proof of vaccination status' to be presented upon entry at all indoor exercise and recreational establishments. Here at Movement Crystal City, we will continue our alignment with the DC heath orders regarding COVID. Beginning Monday, January 24<sup>th</sup>, to enter Movement Crystal City, all patrons 12 and older will need to provide proof of vaccination

Please note that we are also required to have everyone wear masks at all times while in the gym, regardless of vaccination status until the Health Department no longer requires this of gyms.

### What is acceptable vaccination proof?

- A CDC issued vaccination card (original, photocopy, or digital copy/photo)
- Record of immunization from a healthcare provider or public health authority
- A COVID-19 verification app (e.g., VaxYes, Clear, Excelsior, MyIR)
- World Health Organization Vaccination Record

## When does proof of vaccination become a requirement?

It will be required starting on January 24th, but we will begin accepting proof upon check-in on Monday, January 17th to allow you additional time to satisfy this requirement.

## Are there any exemptions?

Anyone who is under the age of 12 will not need to show vaccination proof. Medically exempt or unable to take the vaccine out of a sincerely held religious belief.

• Patrons who have and show documentation of medical or religious exemptions from the COVID-19 vaccine must provide a negative PCR or antigen test within the last 24 hours.

## How do I submit proof of vaccination status?

Vaccination proof should be presented at the front desk and will only need to be brought once. Vaccination proof can also be emailed to <u>crystal@movementgyms.com</u> (Please leave up to 24hours for your account to be updated through email submission).

## Why are you requiring proof of vaccination?

This order was issued by the Mayor of the District of Columbia in the interest of public health and with the health of our community in mind we will align with this order. Once this order is repealed, we will also remove this requirement.
